

Objectives

To reinforce existing S&T dialogues and networks and promote regional integration.

PACE-Net will seek to increase the cooperation between the research organisations and universities in the OCTs and the other countries in the Pacific.

To identify S&T international cooperation activities and programmes towards the Pacific region.

PACE-Net will set up dialogue for bringing together the relevant S&T experts and stakeholders to establish priority areas for SICA and Cooperation programme of FP7.

To examine possible synergies or complementarities with other European instruments, in particular, synergies with the European Development Fund, especially with respect to challenges faced by developing countries.


