Synthesis

Cultural Landspace and Seascape (1)

- Cultural landscape and seascapes on Raiatea Island
- Raiatea is at the centre of the “Polynesian Triangle,”
- Taputapuātea marae dedicated to the god ‘Oro



Synthesis

Cultural Landspace and Seascape (2)

- A traditional landscape surrounds both sides
- The *marae* complex looks out to Te Ava Mo'a
- Atāra motu is an islet in the reef and a habitat for seabirds



Integrity

- The property is a relict and associative cultural landscape
- It is an exceptional example of the juxtaposition and continuity of the ancient and modern



Authenticity

- Credible and objective information
- Intangible sources and oral traditions
- Documentary sources
- Some *marae* have been restored
- The layout of the complex and most of the materials themselves are original.



Impact of World Heritage Listing


- Prestigious UNESCO cultural label
