Factors Affecting Effectiveness

• CT structures not well established

- Disparities in security practices
- Disparities in capabilities
- Disparities in applied ICTs

• CT cultures not well matched to structures

- Gaps in financial transaction practices
- Gaps in weapons tracking capabilities
- Variant attitudes to drug trafficking
