


Asian-Canadians

- Totals: 4.6 million, 15.3% of all Canadians
- By origins: 1.5 million from South Asia, 1.3 million from China, 600,000 from Philippines, 300,000 from other Southeast Asia, 150,000 from Korea, 100,000 from Japan.
- By province: 1.1 million in British Columbia (26%), 2.6 million in Ontario (21%), 550,000 in Alberta (16%) . . . Lowest percent in Newfoundland and Labrador (1.3%)










Ratio of International Departures to National Population




KE Flights from Incheon




Flights in East Asia (noon Sept 27, 2016 - today)
